

Our nursery class explored the letter I through a fun and engaging fine motor peg activity. Children used colorful pom-poms to decorate the letter I with pegs, strengthening their finger muscles while reinforcing letter recognition. The activity also integrated number counting and color coding, making the learning experience even more meaningful. With bright smiles and busy hands at work, the children not only practiced focus and patience but also discovered joyful new ways to interact with letters.



HOP, HEART, HOORAY!! – Letter H

The tiny tots of Nursery had a joyful time exploring the letter H through a creative heart-themed activity and hopping on sleeping lines. Children practiced letter recognition while counting colorful hearts and hopping along the lines. The activity not only reinforced their knowledge of the letter H but also helped build balance, gross motor coordination, and number skills—all while having fun!

1-2-3-4 LET'S HOP SOME MORE!

– Recap of Numbers 1-4

Our Nursery kids had an energetic and fun-filled time revisiting numbers 1-4 through a lively jumping activity with hula hoops. As they hopped into each hoop, children identified the numbers and performed the pre-defined actions for each one. This engaging exercise reinforced number recognition while strengthening gross motor skills. The cheerful blend of movement and numbers made learning active, meaningful, and joyful!



SENSE-ATIONAL EXPLORERS

Junior KG children explored their five senses through fun activities. They identified their bags and their name's first letter using their sense of sight. They explored the scents of different items and spices to learn about pleasant and unpleasant smells. They matched sounds to sharpen their hearing and tasted salty, sweet, bitter, and sour items to discover different flavors. By touching various textures, they learned how things feel and they also understood the importance of washing hands to stay clean and healthy.



ROLLING INTO CIRCLES

This Jr. KG activity was all about exploring the circle shape in a fun and active way. Children picked circle shaped object pictures and collected them as part of an engaging movement based activity. This hands-on experience helped develop shape recognition, gross motor skills, concentration, and observation all while having fun. The children enjoyed learning through play as they connected physical activity with early concepts of math.



THIS OR THAT? LET'S FIND OUT!

Our Sr.KG students explored the concept of "this" and "that" through an engaging interactive activity. By pointing to nearby and distant objects, children learned to differentiate between things that are close (this) and far (that). The activity laid a strong foundation for using demonstrative words correctly in everyday conversations.




'DRESS RIGHT, FEEL BRIGHT'




Social Studies Project Presentation

EVS Activity - Grade 2





