ARYAN KHARE

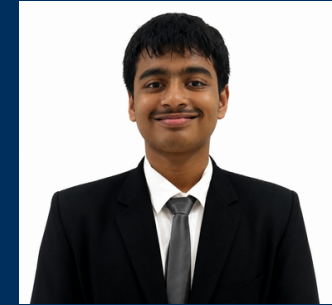

VIHAAN KOTECHA

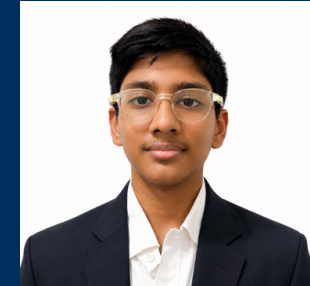
